Local Rules - Sierra Golf Club



1. Out of Bounds (OB):

- a) the area beyond the fence surrounding the course or beyond white poles/lines marking the boundaries of the course,
- b) the club house, driving range and practice green/area.

2. Ground Under Repair (GRU):

- a) marked by blue stakes,
- b) marked by blue or white lines,
- c) all flower beds,

Note: if a player's ball lies in a flower bed, or if a flower bed interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, or if it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found is in a flower bed, the player MUST take relief under Rule 25-1.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE:

Match play – Loss of hole; Stroke play – Two strokes.

3. Integral part of the course:

- a) natural roads,
- b) mulch bark around trees,
- c) thuja trees on the right side of the 12th hole green.

4. Water hazards:

Unmarked water hazards are lateral water hazards and their edge marks its boundaries.

5. Environmentally Sensitive Area (ESA):

The water hazard between 15th & 16th holes marked by red/yellow stakes with green caps is an environmentally sensitive area (ESA) and PLAYER MUST NOT ENTER THIS AREA.

If the ball is found in or if it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found is in

ESA defined as a water hazard or lateral water hazard, the player MUST, under penalty of one stroke, proceed under Rule 26-1.

Note: if ESA interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player **MUST** take relief

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE:

Match play - Loss of hole; Stroke play - Two strokes.

6. Obstructions:

- a) movable: stones in bunkers.
- b) immovable:
 - i. all roads and paths with artificial surface,
 - ii. commercial boards and banners,
 - iii. trees staked, boarded up or with guy ropes,
 - iv. all wooden bridges.

7. Dropping Zone:

If the ball was found in a water hazard located behind the green of the **15th hole** or if it is known or virtually certain that the ball, which has not been found is in that water hazard, the player may:

- a) proceed under Rule 26-1 or,
- b) with a penalty of one stroke drop the ball in "drop zone".

Note: When using a "drop zone" the following provisions apply regarding the dropping and re-dropping of the ball:

- a) the player does not have to stand within the dropping zone when dropping the ball,
- b) the dropped ball must first strike a part of the course within the dropping zone,
- c) if the dropping zone is defined by a line, the line is within the dropping zone,
- d) the dropped ball does not have to come to rest within the dropping zone,
- e) the dropped ball must be re-dropped if it rolls and comes to rest in a position covered by Rule 20-2c(i-vi),
- f) the dropped ball may roll nearer the hole than the spot where it first struck a part of the course, provided it comes to rest within two club lengths of that spot and not into any of the positions covered by (e),
- g) subject to the provisions of (e) and (f), the dropped ball may roll and come to rest nearer the hole than:
 - its original position or estimated position (see Rule 20-2b);
 - the nearest point of relief or maximum available relief (Rule 24-2, 25-1 or 25-3);
 - the point where the original ball last crossed the margin of the water hazard or lateral water hazard (Rule 26-1).

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE:

Match play – Loss of hole; Stroke play – Two strokes.

8. Distance-Measuring Devices:

A player may obtain distance information by use of a distance-measuring device. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. elevation changes, wind speed, etc.), the player is in breach of **Rule 14-3**.

9. Accidental Movement of a Ball on a Putting Green:

Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1 are modified as follows:

When a player's ball lies on the putting green, there is no penalty if the ball or ball-marker is accidentally moved by the player, his partner, his opponent, or any of their caddies or equipment. The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced as provided in **Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1**.

Note: if it is determined that a player's ball on the putting green was moved as a result of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location. A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced.

<u>Note!</u> In case of a storm/lightning, the game on the golf course has to stop immediately (Rule 68), and the siren signals mean:

- a) 1 long signal immediate discontinuation of the game,
- b) 2 short signals resumption of the game,
- c) 3 consecutive signals, repeated discontinuation of the game, with the possibility of completing the hole (**Rule 6-8b**).

All distances on stakes, markers and sprinklers are measured to the centre of the green.
